With reference to the report of the regrettable loss of your son, the late No. 6037 Private H. G. Andrews, 27th Battalion, I am now in receipt of advice which shows that he was killed in action in Image 80n 10.6.18 and was buried at Dive Copse Cemetery near Sailly-le-Sec, 51 miles South South West of Albert,

The utmost care and attention is being devoted where possible to the graves of our soldiers. It is understood that photographs are being taken where practicable, and these are transmitted to next-of-kin when available.

These additional details are furnished by direction, it being the policy of the Department to forward all information received in connexion with deaths of members of the Australian Imperial Force.



With reference to this office communication A.G.3. 2/3/9 of the 8th March, 1922, advising that the abovenamed soldier was buried in Grave 8, Row G. Plot 7 of Heath Military Cemetery, I have to state that such report was erroneous, the correct place of burial of this soldier being Grave 21, Row K. Plot 3, Dive Copse British Cemetery.

The place of burial of this soldier was the subject of correspondence between this office and the Imperial war Graves Commission, and appended hereunder is a copy of the latter administration's final report, which makes it clear that the correct place of burial of this soldier, is Dive Copse British Cemetery:-

A Burial Return held in this office certifies that the remains of a Private Andrews, 27th Battalian, Australian Imperial Force, was buried in Dive Copse British Cemetery on 15th August, 1918, identification being obtained from Metal Disc, but the date of death is not stated.

The reports for the cemetery show the grave in which the remains were buried to be No.21, Row K. Plot 3, which is in conjunction with the original burials in this Cemetery.

According to the exhumation report in connection with the returnal, of the remains in Grave 8, Row G. Plot 7, of Heath Military Cemetery, identification was established by the particulars of 6037 Pte. Andrews 27th Battalion, A.I.F., on a cross and the map reference of exhumation was Sh. 62d.K. 25.a.4.5.

In this connection it is proposed, on the strength of the Burial Authority, to accept Grave 21, Row K, Plot 3, in Dive Copse British Cemetery, as the actual grave of the above-named soldier, and mark Grave 8, Row G, Plot 7, in Heath Military Cemetery to refer to an "Unknown Australian soldier."



With reference to the regrettable loss of the late No.0037 Private H.G.Andrews, 27th Battalian, the overseas authorities now advise that as the result of further investigations made by the Imperial war Graves Commission it has been found that the actual burial place of your brother is in Dive Copse British Cemetery, grave 21, row K, plot 3, and that identity had been established by means of a metal disc.


A cross inscribed with the late soldier's particulars was inadvertently erected in the Heath Military Cemetery and photographs were forwarded to you as depicting his grave - it being understood that his remains had been exhumed from the original burial place and re-interred. I desire to assure you of the Department's profound regret at the distressing circumstances arising.

The military cemeteries are now being reconstructed as rapidly as possible - the temporary crosses being replaced by permanent headstones - and should you desire to obtain a photograph showing the permanent memorial over your brother's grave I have to advise that the military authorities do not propose to supply photographs of the permanent headstones, but it is understood the National Council of the Y.M.C.A., 13 Russell Square, London, W.C.1, are undertaking work of that description - their charge being approximately 12/6 for a negative and three prints.
