Dear Sir, With further reference to the report of the regrettable loss of your brother, the late No. 6282 Private D.L. LLEWELYN, 10th Battalion, I am now in receipt of advice that during the course of exhumation work about 2 miles East of Westhoek the Imperial War Graves Commission was successful in recovering the remains of this soldier which have since been interred with every measure of care and reverence in -

TYNE COT CEMETERY, PASSCHENDAELE,
Plot 28, Row "B", Grave 4.

situated $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles East North-East of Ypres, Belgium, where a permanent headstone of uniform design will be erected and engraved with his full regimental description and date of death, together with any verse or epitaph previously furnished in the form of a personal inscription.

It is the practice of the Commission to notify relatives direct when the headstones are finally in position, and at a later date the opportunity will be afforded you of obtaining a copy of the printed Register containing full particulars of all British and Dominion burials in this Cemetery.
