Dear Madam,

I am in receipt of your last letter dated 29th ultimo and the communications enclosed therein, concerning your son, No. 2093 Driver C. M. Mackie, 3rd Brigade Ammunition Column, of whom no official report has been received. After reading the enclosures I hardly think a cable message of enquiry is warranted as your son has been apparently suffering from a slight touch of fever only and it is not the practice of the overseas authorities to advise us of slight ailments. In the circumstances you may assume he has made satisfactory progress and perhaps ere now has returned to duty. If any official report comes to hand it will be promptly communicated to you.

I regret I am unable to explain why the soldier has not received the parcels you have sent, but I might point out that mail matter for soldiers in the firing line is sent to the Field Post Office for distribution, and if an addressee has been wounded or becomes ill in the interim and is removed to a Base Hospital his mail must necessarily be some time in catching him up.
